Bethesda COVID-19 Update Saturday, 09 May 2020

We would once more acknowledge the Lord's merciful Hand in watching over the three Bethesda Homes during the past week.

We are grateful that currently residents at both the Brighton and Studley Homes continue to be free from COVID-19 symptoms.

At the Harpenden Home we are thankful to report that of the ten residents, currently in the Home, two are continuing to recover from COVID-19 like symptoms - one resident has tested negative for COVID-19 and the test results are awaited for the other. Three who tested positive for the virus have recovered and are back to normal; one who was poorly due to an underlying condition has continued to improve; and the four who have been unaffected by the virus are still free from any symptoms.

In the Lord's purposes, Mrs. M. Crowter passed away peacefully on Sunday, 3 May 2020. Mrs. Crowter had been weakening in the past week. Our thoughts are with the family at this time and also with the staff at the Home who lovingly cared for her. (Details of the funeral will posted on the website.)

We are thankful that the staffing situation remains stable at Brighton and Studley and has improved at Harpenden.

It would be remiss not to once more thank all the Managers and staff within Bethesda, for their tremendous efforts in continuing to ensure that the care provided, over the past weeks to the residents, has remained foremost. I am sure all that have an interest in Bethesda would join in echoing these thoughts.

We would also not forget the loving contributions made by volunteers who have helped in so many different ways - thank you from us all.

In the Lord's mercies, Bethesda has been brought, so far, safely through the COVID-19 epidemic. We do not know what is before us and, as previously reported, Bethesda will continue to act prudently before the Lord in continuing to be vigilant in the implementation of its infection control procedures throughout all the Homes.

As yet, we are not aware of the impact of the proposals for the lifting of the 'lockdown' restrictions might be - which sadly, are due to be announced on Sunday, 10 May 2020.

Victory in Europe (VE) Day 75th Anniversary

Although the Homes were in 'lockdown' on Friday, 8 May 2020, it was still possible to remember the 75th Anniversary of VE Day in the Homes.

In many ways, it must have seemed a contrast to the residents who were able to look back over the past 75 years and reflect on the changes that have taken place and at the same time, we trust, trace out the Hand that brought them safely to this day.

We cannot but notice the sad contrast that on Sunday, 13 May 1945 there was a day of National Thanksgiving for the Lord's deliverance from the hostilities in Europe and what is due to take place, as mentioned, on the forthcoming Sunday, 10 May 2020.

The numbers of residents currently in the Homes are: Brighton 19, Harpenden 10 and Studley 8. Bethesda is able to take admissions into its Homes for either Full-time or Respite care taking into account the current infection control procedures.

The trustees have laid the matter of strengthening our number before the Lord, and in the Lord's provision of Richard Woodhams (Pastor, Haywards Heath) has accepted the invitation to become a trustee of the GSBF and join the Bethesda Committee. We wish him well as he takes on this responsibility at this difficult time.

We would encourage you to continue to pray for Bethesda that the Lord:

- would continue to place His protecting Hand over the residents and staff in the Homes and support Adrian (Topping) in all his responsibilities
- will continue to support the families, relatives and friends of the residents at this time of physical separation from their loved ones
- will make a way for the doors of the Homes to open once more to the families and friends of the residents and those who support in so many ways
- would hear those cries for help in time of need and grant wisdom in those decisions that have to be made both now, if the Lord will, and in the way before us.
